All SME Families,

All students, parents, faculty and staff members, and parishioners of St. Matthew's Episcopal Church and School are invited and encouraged to participate in one of our Lenten projects – cleaning up Bayou Terrebonne and the surrounding waterways and land areas close to those waterways.

Students must be accompanied by an adult, as we will be picking up trash along the roadways – St. Louis Canal Rd. and Hollywood Rd. We will meet at 8:00 AM at the Glen Pope Walking Track on Williams Ave, behind St. Gregory Church and School. You may leave your vehicles parked there. We will cross the bridge and pick up trash along the canal and Lake Houmas for two hours and then turn around and do the other side. Trash bags and gloves will be provided. Participants should wear rubber boots or old athletic shoes (the area may be muddy), jeans, layered shirts (according to weather), and a cap. It would be great if everyone could wear a St. Matthew's shirt and cap. Sun screen and water bottles are recommended. Participants should be cautious of any wildlife in the area and, most importantly, be extremely safe around traffic. We are supposed to have police or fire presence to caution drivers to be on the look-out for the participants.

ALL participants MUST complete and sign a waiver that will be distributed at school before the event and also at the parking area that morning. We will also collect data on the amount and kind of litter that we collect.

All participants are invited to a celebration from noon to 2:00 PM at the Downtown Marina. There will be soft drinks, hamburgers and hot dogs, and entertainment provided to the participants.

If you and/or your family would like to clean up the actual bayou, you may launch your boat at the South Houma Boat Launch. Larger boats will cover the bayou moving south from the Intracoastal Waterway. Smaller boats and kayaks will cover the areas north towards the mall. All boats should meet safety guidelines, and passengers should wear life vests! Please be mindful of bridges during the clean-up.

Trash drop-off points include the Downtown Marina, at the bridges, and along the sides of roadways. The Sherriff's Trustees will pick up the bags on Monday morning.
