- 8. **Walking the Mourner's Path** a ministry that reaches out to provide support and prayer for those suffering from grief. (beginning on Sept. 20th)
- 9. **St. Matthew's Go Green** a new ministry that will work in partnership with our school to promote, encourage, and educate our community on being good stewards of the earth.
- 10. Music Ministry the redevelopment of our choir and music program
- 11. **The Finance Committee** a small group that will work with the rector, Sr. Warden and treasurer to manage the budget.
- 12. **The Stewardship Committee**, a small group that works to help our community recognize and respond to the resources at our fingertips to allow our church to empower our ministry and outreach.

This is an exciting beginning and we are all feeling the joy of seeing our church blossom with new members and ministry. What else will our Lord call us to do? More Bible Studies, more opportunities for outreach, greater outreach to the sick and imprisoned, more continuing education on the Episcopal Faith and practices, opportunities for mission outreach, educational travel, book studies....the possibilities are endless and all so exciting!
